

UK Foodbanks

13 million people live below the poverty line in the UK.

Every day people in the UK go hungry for reasons ranging from redundancy to receiving an unexpected bill on a low income. Trussell Trust foodbanks provide a minimum of three days emergency food and support to people experiencing crisis in the UK.

In 2013-14 foodbanks fed 913,138 people nationwide. Of those helped, 330,205 were children.

Rising food and fuel prices, static incomes, underemployment and changes to benefits are some of the reasons why increasing numbers are being referred to foodbanks for emergency food.

The Trussell Trust partners with churches and communities to open new foodbanks nationwide. With over 420 foodbanks currently launched, their goal is for every town to have one.

Angus Foodbank has now been operating in Montrose since Monday 11th August 2014, and after 5 weeks we have handed out 40 food boxes, comprising 23 single person boxes, 11 x 2 person boxes, 4 x 3 person boxes and 1 box for a family of five or more. We currently operate from Melville South church from the Provost Johnston Road entrance.

There has been some confusion regarding where donations of food are to be left. There is a large box in Tesco, Montrose where food items can be donated, food can also be delivered straight to the Foodbank during opening hours of Monday between 1-3pm and Friday 10 till 12 noon.

Among the questions people have asked is, "what can we donate?"

Milk (UHT or powered)
Fruit juice (long life carton)
Tinned meat/fish
Sugar (500 g)

Cereals

Tinned vegetables
Tinned sponge puddings
Instant Mash Potato
Tinned tomatoes
Pasta sauces
Tinned rice pudding
Jam
Biscuits or snack bars
Tea bags/instant coffee
Tinned fruit

HARVEST OF ENCOURAGEMENT

As our theme for Harvest Thanksgiving this year was the 'Harvest of Encouragement', the young folks of the Church thought it would be good to give a bit of *encouragement* to those struggling in 3rd world countries by *encouraging* the congregation to buy a few more **Fairtrade** goods.



They have calculated that if everyone in our Church bought just one item a month of around £3.00 in value, by next harvest we would, together, have bought around £4,000 worth of Fairtrade goods.

To make it easy to do this, the teenagers have provided **Fairtrade Catalogues** and **order forms** which can be picked up in the vestibule any Sunday. The idea is that we choose something, write it on the order form and pop the form back, with the money, in their Fairtrade decorated box (also in the vestibule) ready to be collected on the first Sunday of every month. They will then order for us and goods will be labelled and left for collection in the vestibule as soon as they arrive.


Many thanks to those who have already ordered goods – if you haven't picked up a catalogue yet, you are *encouraged* to join in anytime!

Fellowship

In several of his letters Paul gives thanks for Christians in various parts of the Middle East, sometimes complimenting them for various aspects of their faith and life. Not that he turned a blind eye to their shortcomings – indeed at times he was forthright (blunt?!). My years of ministry suggests that we are better at pointing out the flaws and failings of our congregations and of our fellow Church members than we are at appreciating their strengths and giving thanks for them.

I'd like to ask you to take a fresh look at our congregation with a view to encouraging a more positive attitude to your fellow members. I appreciate that a good number (probably many more than most people realise) aren't able to get to Church as much as previously but this is for us all. Can we take a leaf out of Paul's book and first and foremost give thanks for one another as fellow Christians, gifts from God to the congregation and pray for one another? Of course, we are not perfect either as a congregation or as



individuals but God has drawn us together to worship him and serve him as his people in this corner of his vineyard. If we were to be aware of the positive qualities and gifts that we have – and at a very basic level give thanks for one another it would be a big step towards us deepening our bonds of fellowship and being more supportive. If we were to pray more for one another then that would draw us closer together and make us more concerned both pastorally and in our outreach activities. More than one person has said recently “there is more of a sense of church family” – not everyone will have experienced that but I believe it is coming and it is certainly a goal we should have. Each of us ought to have a personal relationship with Jesus but God's plan is also to bind us together (with himself) as a fellowship of his people. Let's thank God for one another and work and pray to deepen our fellowship.

for Deaf People




