The day will begin and end in Arbroath St Andrews and there will be workshops during the day in St Andrews and a short walk away in Arbroath Old and Abbey.

The keynote speaker is Very Rev Lorna Hood, Moderator of the 2013 General Assembly. She is a wonderful speaker and her contribution will set us out on the theme of Pilgrimage. Organising the worship will be Rev Peter Gardner, of Renfield St Stephen's Church in Glasgow who has organised imaginative ways of enhancing the worship experience. There will be workshops on “Sit down next to me” – caring for the terminally ill, the Churches in Europe and what they do for Asylum Seekers, Christians in Sport, Spill the Beans, Fresh Expressions and much more.

### Beginning – not the end

There is no doubt that Easter is a wonderful cause for celebration. In one weekend you have the lowest point in human history when on Good Friday the Son of God suffers at hands of the very humanity he came to save AND on Easter Day we have the high point of Jesus' resurrection and the demonstration that his claim to be Saviour was true. (It was of course at the very point of his suffering and death that Jesus won the most marvellous victory though it wasn't until Easter Day that that became apparent).

And yet for all Easter's importance and despite the fact that we cannot hope to begin to explain our position as Christians without reference to what Jesus did at Easter (and why!) we really ought to see Easter as the beginning not the end. Last month I encouraged you see that our Easter faith is something to be enjoyed all year round – not just once a year at Eastertime.

I would like to take that thinking just a little bit further. After feeling the searing loss of their Lord on Good Friday, the disciples were totally bereft, devastated – there appeared to



be no way forward. And then Jesus revealed himself to them – very much alive – and they were quite understandably puzzled but overwhelmed, this time, by joy. As a result of that encounter with the risen Christ and empowered by the Holy Spirit the early Christians went out and proclaimed and lived out the good news of salvation all over the Mediterranean. We're told that they "turned the world upside down".

We are called to live an Easter faith all year round – and we are called to live in and for Jesus. We are not to keep Jesus to ourselves but to spend ourselves for others, speaking and living for him in our community and beyond. The disciples of old would have had no difficulty answering the question "How has meeting with the risen Jesus changed your life?" What would our answer be? How does it show in what we say and do?" We can ensure that Easter is the beginning not the end if we are prepared to take "Easter" into everything we do from now on in.

He is risen! He is risen, indeed!

## Come and have Breakfast

Old & St Andrew's have occasional soup and sandwich lunches which are very popular and are well supported. We tend to have these to raise money for events such as "Souper Sunday" (Church of Scotland HIV/Aids Project) and for our own Summer Mission.

During the week of Summer Mission, the Team stay behind after the activities of the morning Holiday Cub and share a lunch together, this enables friendships to be developed and provides an opportunity for fellowship. Similarly, Messy Church begins with a meal where the whole family sit down together and enjoy a snack tea before everybody gets messy.

Everyone knows that eating together as a family is very important, it is where stories of what is happening at work or school take place. In the Bible, mission and meals have a long history and Jesus spent much of his ministry eating with friends (and strangers). Without too much thought we can quickly think of Jesus visiting Martha and Mary for a meal, and also when he fed the 5,000.

Probably the most talked about meal that Jesus shared is what we know as "The Last Supper". This is not where the "story" ends though – shortly after his death and resurrection – Jesus called to his disciples "Come and have breakfast".

The Mission Task Group invite you to "Come and Have Breakfast" on Easter Sunday at 10am in the church halls. A breakfast of orange juice/tea/coffee/croissants and bacon rolls await. "Come and Have Breakfast" to celebrate and share the joy of Easter together before making your way to church to celebrate Easter.

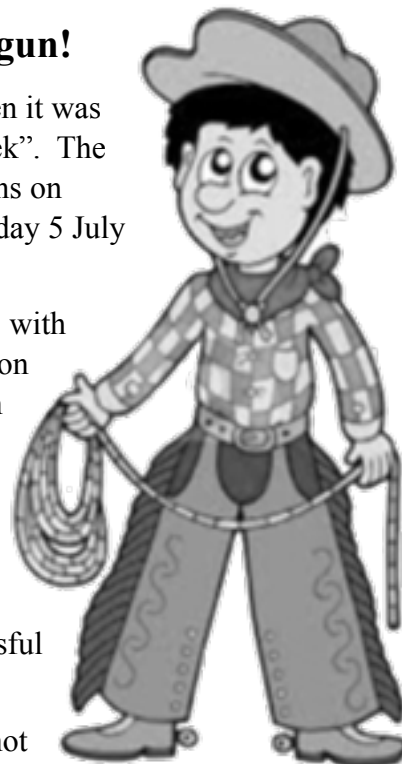
