Darkness shall cover the earth

For some weeks now people have been commenting on the fact that it has been getting dark earlier. And now that the clocks have gone back sunset is creeping earlier – before 4.30pm at the beginning of November to just after 3.30pm by the end of the month. While I like summer I am fortunate to be someone who can cope with darkness and shorter days though I am well aware that many find the winter months difficult – and some exceedingly so. Seasonal Affective Disorder (SAD) can be very debilitating. Even without that many people find things tougher in the dark short days of winter – less motivated, more lethargic, irritable and just not as “with it” as normal. Some have said that this is quite natural – not quite Yogi Bear hibernating for the winter – but a slowing down of rhythm to deal with the season. Yet, as we know society's expectations are high – and work and school don't make a lot of allowances – indeed for school children it's often a time when much is expected – and even our church programme is particularly busy.



were at their lowest ebb, the prophets announced a message of hope – arise shine your light is coming. They pointed to an advent – a coming – both of a Saviour and of the Spirit of God. I am not suggesting that winter blues (or worse) simply disappear at the mention of Jesus but I would like to remind us all that in a world where there appears to be a thick mist that clouds things spiritually for many people God is still there for us and is working out his purposes for good. We have his assurance that “his light will come”. “The light shines in the darkness and the darkness has not overcome it.” All year round, not only at this time of year, Christians are encouraged to rise and shine (in a spiritual sense) and embrace the “light” – the coming of Christ, the Saviour. We don't have to wait until Christmas, we don't have to wait until God's glory is clear and obvious – we can and should be party to preparing for that now when things are still rather misty and gloomy in a spiritual sense. But we need to be ready, on the front foot, leaning into God's positive and glorious future. Arise shine – for your light is coming!
