Summer Mission Banner

In 2006 Old and St Andrew's entered into a 3 year contract with the Church of Scotland's Impact Team for the purpose of running a Summer Mission. The Impact Team worked alongside the congregation for a period of 3 years helping to facilitate the running of the Children's Holiday Club and other events throughout the week.



When the 3 year term came to an end, the Impact Team presented the congregation with the Summer Mission Banner that hangs proudly in the church. The boat at the centre of the banner is the symbol of the Impact Team (a division of the Mission and Discipleship Council).

Surrounding the boat are the various "Logo's" that have identified the themes of the Holiday Clubs held and the Summer Mission Team are extremely grateful to Barbara Sharp for sewing the appropriate logo on the banner as each year has passed. Barbara has intimated that as the Banner has no more space and a new one is required, that this would be a good time for her retire from this duty. A large and appreciative audience of over 100 enjoyed a musical evening in the church. The evening was to raise money for Nyumbani project and Alison Stedman gave a brief talk about its progress. Nyumbani is based in Nairobi, Kenya and is a special home that cares for HIV/AIDS orphans. Opened in 1992 with 3 orphans it currently provides care for 121 children. The Rotary Movement's goal is to promote awareness of the plight of such orphans in Kenya and to raise funds in support of current and future care-based projects. 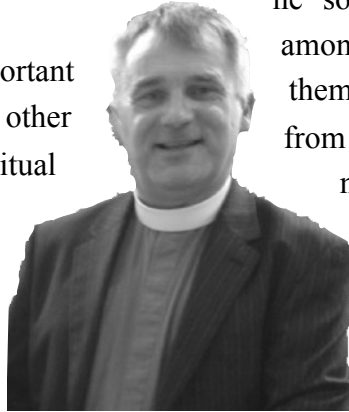

Turning Point

We are about to enter Lent. More important than any plans to give up chocolate or other goodies for a spell Lent is about spiritual preparation for Easter. It mirrors that penultimate period of Jesus' earthly ministry when "he set his face towards Jerusalem". The focus of his thinking and teaching was on his journey towards Jerusalem and on the manner and meaning of his death. He was more open and forthright, sharing his understanding of his death as the means of people's salvation, of God coming close to his people in and through his life. He was part of that message. There was an urgency about communicating his message to all who would listen as there was about preparing his closest followers to continue his mission and ministry thereafter. It wasn't simply a matter of passing on hints, tips and good ideas. Above all, he wanted them to be prepared spiritually. He looked to God and prayed that he would send the Holy Spirit upon them and those who would follow (including us) that they and we might be given all the spiritual resources and equipping for the vital task of sharing the good news.



he sowed seeds of the new life to come among his followers. He would still be with them (and us) albeit in a different way but from that point on it was the disciples (as it is now his modern day disciples) who would be responsible, humanly speaking, for the proclamation and living out of the good news.

I believe we are at turning point in the history of the Church of Scotland and even of the churches in Montrose. The temptation is there to batten down the hatches and protect our traditions and the familiar. The opportunity is to take stock from the past but move much more to find ways of reaching out to a largely unchurched population with dynamic versions of the unchanging gospel that would be relevant and effective in touching and changing a society that is in dire need of love, forgiveness, faith and hope. It is no easy prospect – but neither was Jesus' journey to the cross. How do we do the new while looking after the existing? No easy answers but together we are called to walk together trusting in the Lord who promises never to leave us. Are you willing to join in the fellowship of the cross?
