much went on in the Church"; "It was great to see what is happening and to catch up with friends over a cuppa"; "I am really enthused by some of the forward plans and want to get involved"


We have a number of people who have volunteered to become involved in different activities in the Church and we are pleased that members have responded positively with practical as well as financial support.

How God says "Thank you"

"If you want something done ask a busy person". There is some truth in that though, of course, it can be overdone. But there is good biblical precedent for greater responsibility being given to those who have proved themselves faithful in "smaller" things. Rather than us being rewarded with an easier life, God turns things on their head and gives us the opportunity to serve him in further ways. So, you could argue that God says "Thank you" by giving us more to do!

That sounds a bit topsy turvy from the way we usually do things (but I have said before that God often turns our thinking on its head) though actually it is an important aspect of the Christian faith. The essence of faith is loving service – we are here, not for our own sakes but to serve God and our neighbour. Jesus was the prime example – the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve. He gave his very life for us.

I want to say a very big thank you to all those who played any part in the recent Aspire programme. It was a huge exercise and a lot of work. No doubt there are some things that we might have done better and we will do a thorough review but

without doubt the hard work has achieved a lot – and not just on the financial front. To those of you who attended the gatherings thank you for coming

- most people weren't in any rush to get away and were happy to chat. To those who were reliant on the booklet I hope that you sensed the tone of the programme was not just about money but about developing the life of the

congregation. I'd like to pay particular thanks to the visitors and to those who organised everything. Many of you stretched yourselves and I hope you are none the worse of that – some of you said "I managed better than I thought". Thank you too to those of

you who have indicated that you'd like to get involved in something new.

We need to move forward and yes that will involve us in more work. But God promises that he will provide us with all that we require to do his work. Let's give thanks for all has gone into Aspire and for the response but let's not be surprised if God says "thank you" by prompting us to grow and develop and share in more going forward (while perhaps looking to train and encourage others to take on some things from us).
